### **Reporting a Vulnerability**

If you believe you've found a security vulnerability in any of our in-scope products or services, we ask that you report it to us as soon as possible. Please provide the following information in your report:

- A clear and concise description of the vulnerability
- Steps to reproduce vulnerability
- Affected product(s) and version(s)
- Any potential impact of the vulnerability
- Your contact information (if you wish to be acknowledged)

### **Guidelines**

To ensure responsible disclosure, we ask that you adhere to the following guidelines:

- Do not publicly disclose the vulnerability until we have had a reasonable opportunity to address it.
- Avoid testing in production environments. Use test environments whenever possible.
- Do not exploit vulnerability or access user data beyond what is necessary to demonstrate vulnerability.
- Act in good faith and avoid causing harm to our systems or data.

### **Our Commitment**

When you report a vulnerability in accordance with this policy, Paraben Corporation will:

- Acknowledge receipt of your report within [Number] business days.
- Provide timely updates on our progress toward remediation.
- Make a reasonable effort to validate and address vulnerability.
- Consider public acknowledgment for your responsible disclosure (if you wish).

### **Out of Scope**

The following types of reports are considered out of scope for this program:

- Vulnerabilities in third-party software or websites
- Social engineering attacks
- Physical security vulnerabilities
- Denial-of-service attacks
- Spam or phishing techniques
